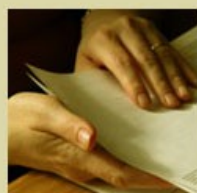
The Stop Community Food Centre, Toronto, ON \$25,000

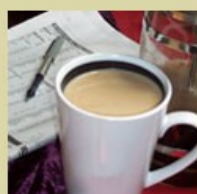

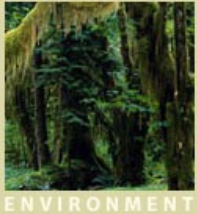
Environmental Law Centre (Alberta) Society, Edmonton, AB

HOUSING INITIATIVES
